The Office of Sustainability

<u>The Office of Sustainability (OS)</u> is the primary hub for sustainability at UW-Madison. The OS administers programs, hosts events, and promotes green practices across campus.

GREEN FUND

<u>The Green Fund</u> supports student-initiated projects that reduce the environmental footprint and operating costs of on-campus facilities in the areas of waste, water, and energy.

2019 HIGHLIGHTS

Office of Sustainability interns piloted the <u>Compost Stewards program</u>, implemented in tandem with the <u>Green Office certification program</u>. The Compost Stewards program aims to increase composting practices on campus through education and logistical support.



With the support of the Green Fund, University Housing and student group HELIOS placed 132 <u>solar panels</u> on top of Gordon Dining & Event Center. The solar panels will produce over 42,000 kW of energy on average over the course of a year. View the live dashboard!



In August 2019, UW–Madison submitted its first <u>Sustainability Tracking</u>, <u>Assessment & Rating</u> <u>System (STARS) report</u>, including a comprehensive greenhouse gas emissions inventory. The university's Silver rating enables UW-Madison to highlight achievements, identify opportunities for improvement, and set a baseline for future performance goals.

Where Does Your Waste Go?

MULTI-STREAM RECYCLING

UW-Madison separates <u>recyclable</u> <u>material</u> into three streams: office paper, mixed paper, and glass/plastic/metal, which we send to vendors to be processed. Where multi-stream recycling is not available, all recyclables go into the same bin.



COMPOST

UW-Madison collects food waste from all residence halls and dining halls on campus for its <u>composting program</u>. Every dorm has compost available in either the trash room or kitchen.



LANDFILL

When in doubt, throw it out! Do not try to recycle or compost items about which you are unsure. It's better to avoid contaminating the compost and recycling streams. Learn about how to <u>Recycle Right</u> on campus.
